



SHINE—Sustainable Home Initiative in the New Economy

SHINE is a residential weatherization rebate program offering City of Atlanta homeowners (single-family) the ability to **receive up to a \$2,000 rebate** towards qualifying improvements. Improvements include, but are not limited to: duct and air sealing, insulation improvement, caulking, weather-stripping, and window replacement.

Residents may also qualify for a **potential \$1,500 federal income tax credit** if they make certain home energy improvements during 2010.

How do I sign up for the Pilot Program:

1. Homeowner completes **home energy assessment**; completed by a Home Performance with Energy Star qualified contractor.
2. Homeowner receives a **list of recommended upgrades/improvements**, selects a contractor, and completes a work order; has 14 days to undertake a contract.
3. Homeowner and contractor sign off on SHINE rebate form and submit it for review.
4. City of Atlanta undertakes **quality assurance review** of rebate forms and work orders.
5. Work begins. Rebates paid once work is complete.

City of Atlanta Residents—receive up to \$5,400 in rebates for residential weatherization and energy efficiency retrofits!
